

GCSE DRAMA THEATRE TRIP

Woodbrook Vale GCSE Drama students were awed by a touring matinee performance of the Olivier-award-winning 'Life of Pi' at Leciester's Curve Theatre on Thursday 13th March. The book by Yann Martel, was adapted for the stage by Lolita Chakrabarti and premiered in June 2019 at the Crucible Theatre, Sheffield, before transferring to the Wyndham Theatre in London's West End in November 2021 where it went on to win Best New Play, Best Actor, Best Actor in Supporting Role, Best Lighting Design and Best Set Design in the 2022 Olivier Awards.





The story of struggling to survive the dangers of being shipwrecked and marooned at sea will inspire students' responses to the heavily-weighted Live Theatre section of the written exam where they review a recent experience of live performance.



With an abundance of jaw-dropping puppets, including a giraffe, a goat (named 'Buckingham'), a zebra (named 'Black and White'), an orangutan (named 'Orange Juice'), a hyena, a turtle, fish, butterflies, and of course, Richard Parker: the captivating tiger, there'll be plenty for Year 10 and Year 11 GCSE Drama students to write about.

'Life of Pi' is certainly an experience none of use fortunate enough to attend the trip will soon forget! Immensly enjoyable and highly recommended!

SPOTLIGHT ON AUTHORS

Diary of a WImpy Kid author Jeff Kinney didn't grow up wanting to be a children's author. His dream was to become a newspaper cartoonist but he wasn't able to get his comics sold.

Jeff Kinney was born in 1971 in Maryland and attended the University of Maryland in the early 1990s. It was there that Jess ran a comic strip called "Igdoof" in the campus newsletter. He knew he wanted to be a cartoonist.

However, Jeff was not successful getting his comic strip picked up after college, and in 1998 he started writing down ideas for Diary of a WImpy Kid, which he hoped to turn into a book. Jeff worked on the book for six years before publishing it online on fun brain.com in daily instalments.

In 2006, Jeff signed a multi-book deal with published Harry N. Abrams, Inc. to turn Diary of a Wimpy Kid into a print series. The First Diary of a Wimpy Kid book was published in 2007 and became an instant bestseller. Just a year later, more than 100,000 copies were in print in the United States alone. With each subsequent book, in-print numbers continue to grow both in the U.S and abroad. There are now more than 290 million copies of the series in print worldwide.

The Diary of a Wimpy Kid series has been a permanent fixture on the USA Today, Wall Street Journal, and Publishers Weekly bestseller lists. The series has remained on the New York Times bestseller lists since the publication of the first book, for more than 775 weeks total, and more than 350 on the series list. The books are currently available in 84 editions and in 69 languages.

Since initial publication in 2007, the series has gone on to win many regional and national awards around the globe including two Children's Choice Book Awards and six Nickelodeon Kids' Choice Awards for Favourite Book. Jeff Kinney was also named one of the Time Magazine's most influential people in the world.

Jeff is the creator of Poptropica, which was named one of the Time's 50 Best Websites. He spent his childhood in the Washington D.C area and moved to New England in 1995. Jeff lives with his wife and two sons in Massachusetts, where they own a book store, An Unlikely Story.
