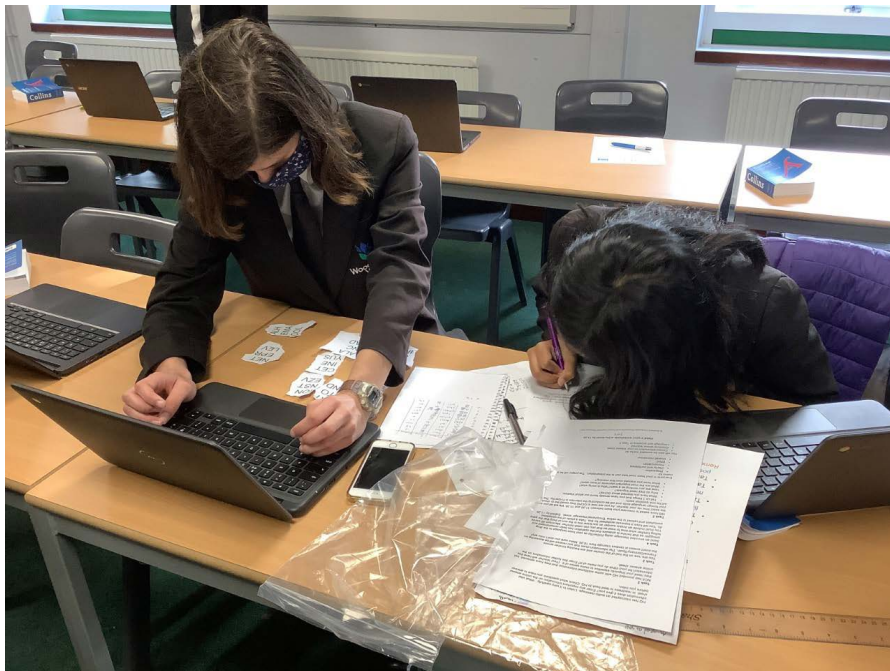
### MFL Careers Workshop

## Careers That Link to Humanities

### What does an Archaeologist do?

Archaeologists wash, sort, catalogue, and store recovered artefacts after bringing them back from the field. They analyse individual artefacts, but also may sort them into groups to see patterns.

They investigate historic and prehistoric sites and physical remains to understand human links to the past and to preserve past cultures. Archaeologists find clues about the past. They use a variety of extraction or digging techniques.

### How does it link to Humanities?

Archaeology examines records from the past that could include diaries, census, and tax records; deeds; maps; and photographs. Through combining the use of documentation and archaeological evidence, archaeologists gain a better understanding of the past and human behaviour.
